Supply Network Design, Logistics; Planning and Scheduling; Supply Chain Adaptation, Inventory Control, Autonomous Systems, Complex Adaptive Systems, Optimal Control Theory, Model-Predictive Control, Adaptive Control, Stability Analysis, Robustness and Resilience; RFID and Event Management Systems, Applications and case studies.
